**Select Target Six-Point Sweep of Chesapeake
Haddonfield, NJ—June 27th, 2010**



The Jersey Select (1-6) will be looking to get another win against the Chesapeake Charge (2-3-3) when the Maryland squad visits Paul VI High School in Haddonfield this Monday at 7:00pm.

The Select got their only win of the season so far against the Charge on May 22nd, taking their chances on goal to prove that efficiency really is key to a winning performance.

After the match, co-head coach George Rhea praised the young talent the squad had to offer. Rhea was ecstatic with the girls, who grafted hard for the best result they could. "While the younger girls were nervous and, to a certain extent, scared of the responsibility put upon them in the first game of the season, they didn't back down," he explained. "Younger kids can play too, and we're going to continue with our diverse age range in training as we expect more greatness to come from the player pool."

Meanwhile, the team will be hoping to build on their 4-1 defeat to the Philadelphia Independence after a ten-minute closing stretch saw the Select concede three goals. "I think we were much better defensively until the last five minutes of the game when we started pushing players forward," said co-head coach Erwin van Bennekom. "We played quality football and decided to take the risk to get a late equalizer, but the Independence were a strong team. We'll build on this against Chesapeake on Monday."

Chesapeake Charge have had a very varied season in terms of performances. After being defeated twice and grabbing two draws in their first four games, the squad managed to get seven points from three matches, including a valuable 1-0 win over the Independence on June 19th.

Coming off the back of a 1-0 defeat to table-topping Lancaster Inferno on Saturday (June 26th), the Charge will be looking to make their record 3-3-3 and even things out in their inaugural season. And setting them up for the possibility of a winning 4-3-3 record for 2010 when they close their campaign against TSC Maryland Pride at Howard Community College on July 9th.
